PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES

For Students with Disabilities

What are Pre-Employment Transition Services?

Pre-Employment Transition Services, also called "Pre-ETS," — offered to any student with a disability — aids students in exploring and planning for successful future employment, through targeted training in:

- Career exploration
- Workplace readiness
- Counseling on postsecondary education
- Self advocacy
- Work-based learning

Services Offered

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Counselors and Pre-ETS Instructors:

- Attend individualized education program (IEP) meetings with parents and students
- Conduct Job Readiness workshops at schools
- Provide one-on-one counseling and coordination services with eligible clients

Community Partners*:

Provide Pre-ETS instruction for clients in either one-on-one or group settings, in the following ways:

- Contracted Service: The Utah State Office of Rehabilitation (USOR) has contracted with community partner agencies to provide Pre-ETS instruction for eligible and potentially eligible students, helping to ensure these services are available statewide.
- Fee-for-Service: Community partner agencies provide specific Pre-ETS allowable services for eligible clients, authorized by a VR Counselor.

Eligible Students for Pre-ETS

- 1. Must be aged 14-21, and
- 2. Eligible for and receiving services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) or is an individual with a disability for purposes of section 504, and
- 3. Is enrolled in a secondary or postsecondary educational program

NOTE: Receiving Pre-ETS instruction provided by one of our USOR Sponsored contracts is the beginning of a continuum of services USOR offers to students with disabilities. Students with disabilities do not need to be a USOR-Vocational Rehabilitation client to receive Pre-ETS through our contracts, but may apply for VR services at any time. However, contractors will confirm that students meet criteria to participate in their services prior to commencing with services.



Pre-ETS Offered

1. CAREER EXPLORATION COUNSELING

Explore skills, abilities and interests, and what options for careers are available for each individual through review of in-demand occupations, career pathways and local labor market information.

2. WORKPLACE READINESS TRAINING

Develop social and employment skills, including financial literacy, social skills and independent living skills.

3. COUNSELING ON POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

Understand options for higher education, including requirements for attending, ability to be successful, accommodations available to students and financial aid.

4. SELF-ADVOCACY

Learn to effectively express interests and desires, be able to appropriately request accommodations, and learn how to network and advertise skills and abilities to others.

5. WORK-BASED LEARNING

Gain experience in utilizing social and employment skills in a real-world environment through job shadowing, work-based training, or summer work experiences.

The Utah State Office of Rehabilitation (USOR) provides transition services, including Pre-ETS, to eligible students with disabilities as they transition from high school to adulthood and employment.

Our goal

We assist students with disabilities who are eligible, and potentially eligible, for services in preparing for employment and adulthood. Through our services, we help students with disabilities prepare for, obtain and maintain employment.

How We Help

USOR provides designated Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) Transition Counselors to serve as a liaison to high schools and charter schools in the state. We partner with members of the school, family, and Individualized Education Program (IEP) team, as well as other adult service agencies, to help ensure that transition-aged youth with disabilities have the support needed to successfully transition from high school to adulthood, independence and employment.
