Job Seeker Resources

The Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) program assists eligible individuals with disabilities to prepare for, obtain or maintain employment and achieve independence. VR services are designed to meet the eligible individual's unique employment needs including:

DIAGNOSTIC AND EVALUATION

Medical, psychological and other examinations and tests are used to understand your disability and need for specific services.

COUNSELING AND GUIDANCE

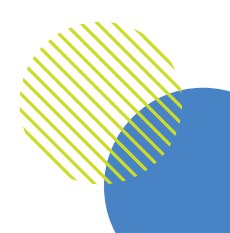
Vocational counseling helps you understand your potential, rely on your abilities, set realistic vocational goals, develop successful work skills and begin a satisfying career.

RESTORATION

Medical and psychological services, which include treatment and equipment, ensures your disability is stable and you are prepared to pursue employment.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

VR may assist you in obtaining assistive technology, which is any equipment or device that provides greater functioning and independence in home, education or work environments.





TRAINING



Education may be needed to prepare for employment including basic academic, vocational/technical, college, supported employment, independent living skills, work adjustment and work-based training.

JOB PLACEMENT



Job development, counseling, coaching, customized employment, self-employment assistance or on-the-job training are services that may be offered.

FOLLOW-UP SERVICES



Once employed successfully for at least 90 days, VR may close your case. However, if you have trouble keeping your job, VR may assist with short-term services, even after your case is closed.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES



Additional services to support your success may include interpreters, readers, transportation, licenses, fees, tools or equipment.
